REMEMBERING MEMPHIS, 2010

In June, convention attendees returned to their home states saying, "You should have been there," to friends that were unable to attend. This year's convention in Memphis was an experiment that worked. Never before has a convention been jointly sponsored by three state societies, but we feel this will happen again in the future. I was amazed that during the entire convention I never received a complaint about the hotel, the tours, the food, the speakers, or anything else. I did not even receive complaints about out hot, humid Memphis weather.

The convention began with a kick-off cocktail party at the home of a very gracious host, Sarah Gurley. A Graceland tour followed on Thursday morning. That evening, seventy-five of our convention attendees gathered at Central Barbeque for a real Memphis barbeque dinner. Each of the following days was delegated to a different state, with each state planning its own program and speakers and providing its own table decorations and door prizes. There were too many marvelous speakers to mention them all here, but everyone of them was well received. (John Crawford, for one, was given a standing ovation.)

After our Sunday night reception during which we enjoyed a sing-a-long to the talented piano playing of Elva Avara, officers were installed, our main speaker- Lola Haskins- gave one of the most outstanding talks ever given at an NFSPS convention; and our contest chairman, Christine Beck, announced the big money contest awards.

The last event of the convention was our Monday morning downtown tour that took those who wanted to see more of the city to see such sights as Beale Street, St. Jude Hospital, and the Peabody ducks. What a joy it was to have so many poets from all over the country with us in Memphis. We could start by thanking people such as our registrar. Sarah Gurley, who handled such a difficult job with efficiency and dedication; our tri-state coordinator, Ann Carolyn Cates, who unified all of our effortsmaking our cooperative venture possible; Dr. Emory Jones and Jim Barton, who coordinated our Mississippi and Arkansas activities; Prince McLemore, who handled the book room so well that others want to copy his methods; and so many others. I wish I could thank them all, but there were perhaps forty or fifty different people in our three states that contributed to our efforts and I would not want to leave any of them out.

My thanks to all of you who attended. I hope you remember Memphis favorably, and I know we will have fond memories in Arkansas, Mississippi and Tennessee, of being your hosts.
