President's Message

Dear NFSPS Poets:



"I will arise and go now, and go to Innisfree . . . and live alone in the bee-loud glade." As Yeats reminds us, the imaginative act of creating and crafting poetry is often—and perhaps rightly—one of isolation, of private meditation, quiet work, and thought. But at the same time this isolation keeps us from sharing our work, from trying new things, and—too often from learning and growing as poets. I think that's why I find our conventions, especially our national conventions, so appealing. They bring us together with other poets to share, to perform, to learn, and even to socialize. Our June meeting in gracious Indiana, in the Crossroads of America, gave us opportunities to do all of these things—to share our work in an impromptu "jukebox" poetry reading, to perform at late

and early readings, to learn from Paddy Lynn as she channeled Emily Dickinson for a rapt audience, or from Mark Turcotte's wry humor and his powerful evocations of his native experience. And of course there were the contest readings, which kept so many of us on the edge of our seats, waiting to hear our own names called! Our hosts from the Indiana State Federation of Poetry Clubs worked hard to ensure that everything was as it should be, and that all were made to feel welcome and very much a part of things. It was indeed a Poetry Extravaganza in the Crossroads of America! (Be sure you stay tuned for news on next year's convention in New Mexico, which also promises a magical excursion, this time to the Land of Enchantment!)

But it's time to introduce myself. I've been involved with NFSPS since the early 1990's, as a member of the League of Minnesota Poets (where I grew up), and of the Alabama State Poetry Society (where I live and work). Many of you know my parents, Claire and Alan Downes, who worked together to serve as NFSPS Contest Chair and Contest Clerk. Some of you will also know my wife and two sons, who attend nationals when it works with their schedules (and offers age-appropriate amusement, I think). I've been a poet just about as long as I can remember, but of course I also have a dayjob working for Auburn University, where I have the chance to teach both the study of poetry and poetry-writing.

I look forward to serving as NFSPS President, and I am deeply grateful to the many board officers I've worked with over the years, who have demonstrated again and again what service and commitment mean for our organization. Whether I was learning to act as Historian, as Judges' Chair, or as Chair of the Stevens Competition, there was always someone before me who had done it right, and who could help me learn how to those who attended and participated to make this a very successful convention, fulfill their role (almost) as well. In taking on this new honor and responsibility, I especially want to thank Russell Strauss, our immediate past President.

Poets are special people, he reminds us every time he writes, and he is absolutely right. But poets like Russell, in their capacity for commitment and service, in their never-failing good humor and commonsense, are especially special. I can only hope to continue his traditions as we move NFSPS forward into this young century. The challenge of the presidency is significant, and no doubt it will afford less time than I would like for retreating to places like the Lake Isle of Innisfree. But I trust you allpoets and special people that you are—will help me keep hearing that call of poetry and of the imagination, "to hear it," as Yeats said, "in the deep heart's core." Thank you for this opportunity to serve.
